150th Anniversary of Canonization of Saint Josaphat

On Sunday, June 25, 2017, His Beatitude Sviatoslav and the entire Ukrainian Catholic Church will celebrate 150th Anniversary of Canonization of St. Josaphat. The Divine Liturgy will be celebrated on the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. St. Josaphat, Bishop of the Ukrainian Catholic Church founder of the Order of St. Basil the Great. On June 29, 1867 Pope Pius IX canonized Blessed Josaphat and declared St. Josaphat as the Patron of Rus'. St. John Paul II called Saint Josaphat "apostle of unity". St. Josaphat is known as the patron of Ukraine. November 14 is the Feast Day of St. Josaphat.
