ORTHODOX? - Why do we

say orthodox Christians when we are Catholic Christians?

Let's take a look at the word ORTHODOX - definition: conforming to what is generally or traditionally accepted as right or true; established and approved. When we look at the word with a big "O", it is the name given to the faithful who are from the Constantinople tradition and Catholic with a big "C" was given to the faithful who are from the Roman tradition.

These names were given to the groups after the Church was divided into two, know as the Great Schism of 1054. Before this they were the same church using different traditions for worship. By the definition both the Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church are orthodox and the Orthodox Church and the Catholic Church are catholic which means universal.

In the Divine Liturgy, the word orthodox is used when referring to the members of the Church because we are saying what we believe is TRUE and RIGHT and ESTABLISHED and APPROVED. In the Council of 325, when the Creed was developed, we have in the last few lines ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC, and APOSTOLIC CHURCH. No other churches in the Christian world can claim these words HOLY (from God), CATHOLIC (universal), Apostolic (given to the Apostles from Jesus Christ Himself) but the Catholic and Orthodox Churches.

We can hope and pray that Pope Francis and Patriarch Bartholomew, the leader of the Orthodox Church will fix the break in the Church to make it ONE again.
