## Preparing for Liturgy

Part 2 of 3

In preparing to coming into the presence of God and as we tidy ourselves up, we need to prepare ourselves physically. Growing up, we had school clothes, play clothes and church clothes. Where have the church clothes gone? We have choices to make when it comes to fashion. We look at people by how they dress. You treat people differently by the way they dress and may not even be aware of it. If a man walks up to you in shorts and a t-shirt, you would think of him as just another guy. What if the same man walked up to you in his military uniform? You would treat him differently. You would show him respect. The same is true on how we dress. No one would mow the lawn in an evening gown or tux. When you wear different clothes you behave differently. Your posture and body language is different. This holds true to coming to church. We need to dress appropriately because we are coming into His presence. The service man that was mentioned earlier will act differently when in military dress. If you were to meet the president or the pope, how would you dress in their presence? They are just men. How would you dress if you could physically meet Jesus? Coming to church is coming into His presence.
