#### **Guidelines for Parishes upon Resumption of Public Services**

Churches are open for public celebration of the Divine Services, where it is permissible, with safety guidelines outlined below:

- Social distancing of 6 feet must be maintained:
  while seating or standing in the pews between non-family member
  while standing in line for Communion and returning to the pew
- People are encouraged to wear face masks.
- Veneration of icons, etc. should done without touching or kissing them.
- There will not be any coffee and snack follow Liturgy until further notice.
- Parishioners should be reminded that if they are not feeling well that they should stay at home and reminded that they are not bound by the Sunday obligation if they are ill.
- When receiving Communion, open your mouths wide, do not touch the spoon and do not cough or sneeze upon it. Each communicant will receive Eucharist from an unused spoon.
- Collection basket will be on a table so that parishioners may leave their offerings.
- Sacrament of Penance must be administered in safe space with keeping social distance.

Please consider other precautionary measures! As always, use common sense.

Calling all Christians - Next Sunday is the Feast of the Descent of the Holy Spirit know to most as Pentecost and to Byzantines as Green Sunday. Liturgical colors have been talked about before. Gold and white are worn most Sundays; blue for the Mother of God; and red for Martyrs and for the Cross and Fasting times of the year. Green is worn for Pentecost. Green is the sign for rebirth with the spring. The Church marks Pentecost as the birthday of the Church. This is the day that the Trinity was revealed completely by the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the Mother of God as well as the disciples. The descent of the Holy Spirit gave them the courage and knowledge to go and spread the Holy Gospel to all the world. We join in the descent of the Holy Spirit upon us from our Chrismation. After we are baptized, the priest completes the Mystery of Chrismation. We were anointed with special oil that the Bishop blesses on Holy Thursday. As the priest anoints us, he calls on the Holy Spirit to over shadow us and give us the knowledge of God to spread to all just as those the Holy Spirit descended upon 10 day after Christ's Ascension. As a disciple, we are to take the Gift from the Holy Spirit and spread the Word to all. It is not just the job of the bishop, priest, deacon or religious, but your job as well. We could call this the "grassroots" effort. We are to let others see the Holy Spirit in us. We are to let the Holy Spirit work through us to tell those around us about God. Too often, we are afraid to share out faith with others. If we let the Holy Spirit work in us, others will see that we are different and want to be like us. We should not shove God on people. They should see that God is with us and want Him to be with them too. You are Christ's disciples and are to bring others into the flock and so that they can become disciples and bring others to the flock, too. Let's make faith the contagion and share it with other and let it spread to all the earth. Wear your green on Sunday. May the Holy Spirit come upon you and the power of the Most High overshadow you.
