Holy Days of Obligation

The Ukrainian Greek Catholic

Church has selected sacred times that the faith are obligated to attend: in addition to all Sundays - Christmas, Theophany, Annunciation, Easter,

Ascension, Dormition, and Sts. Peter and Paul. One may ask why these day were selected. Christmas is the incarnation of God as man. Theophany is the baptism of Christ where God reveal Jesus as His beloved Son. Annunciation when Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary. Easter is the day Jesus rose from the dead. Ascension is when Jesus rose to heaven. The Dormition is when Mary fell asleep and Jesus took her to heaven. Finally, Sts. Peter and Paul, this is the uniting of Christ's Church. Peter wrote to the Hebrews and Paul to the Gentiles calling all to know Jesus as Lord and Savior. Other Holy Days are observed and should be honored but are not obligatory to attend church.
