Merriam Webster defines leave-taking as departure or good-bye. In the Church, Holy Days are celebrated for 8 days. Leave-taking is the final day for the celebration of the feast. For example, the Church has been celebrating the Dormition of the Mother of God since August 15 and today is the last day for this year the feast is celebrated. If one would attend daily liturgy, the special readings for the Dormition would have been read during the Liturgy for 8 days. Easter being the Feast of feasts is celebrated for 40

days. Major feasts have an 8 day celebration and some minor feasts have a one day celebration. Feasts with 8 day celebrations: Birth of the Mother of God, Presentation of the Mother of God, Birth of Jesus, Theophany, Presentation of our Lord, Ascension, Pentecost, Transfiguration, and Dormition.
