Every time we are at liturgy, we should sing a joyful noise to the Lord. The Divine Liturgy was never to be a passive experience. The Eastern Church uses the whole body to worship the Lord. We smell the incense and the beeswax of the candles. We taste the Holy Eucharist. We touch icons through a kiss, make the sign of the cross many, many times. We use our bodies when we process on Holy Days, make prostrations during lent. We see the richly decorated vestments of the bishop, priest, deacon and altar server. We see the colors of the season in the altar cloths. We hear the Word of the Lord. We hear the singing of the Divine Liturgy. To participate wholly in church, we need every part of our being to worship the Lord. Let us make a joyful noise to the Lord. Everyone in church should sing in church. Some say the singing is praying twice. Everything we are came from God. He gave you your voice. No one can say that they can't sing because does not make mistakes.
