The role of Cantor and Reader are essential to the Divine Liturgy. They are to help lead the people to God.

The Reader of the Epistles reads letters from the Apostles to the people in the faith communities. What is amazing is that the Epistles were written 2000 years ago and are still topics for life today. The reader will share the letters to the people for the people to learn from the early Christians.

The Cantor leads the singing of the services. A parish is best to have several cantors to share the work of leading the singing. When a parish has one cantor, the cantor is expected to be at all services. We know with schedules that many times it is not possible to do. Having several cantors share the duties would help the parish.

It is best for a parish to have several Readers and Cantors. If you would like to help the parish by being a Reader of Cantor, see Fr. Andriy.


