FAMINE GENOCIDE IN UKRAINE

A Time of Remembrance...

November 27, 2020 is a day of remembering those who perished in the Holodomor. The 1932–1933 famine in Ukraine is known as *Holodomor*, which literally means hunger extermination. The Soviet Union dictator Joseph Stalin strategically used the famine to repress Ukrainian nationalists and peasants who opposed collectivization. Furthermore, Stalin’s policies made hunger a weapon against what he perceived was an emerging independence movement in the Soviet Republic of Ukraine. Soviet officials seized food from starving peasants and prevented them from fleeing to teach them subservience to the Soviet Union. The Holodomor genocide caused the death of an estimated 3.5 million people, although some estimates claim a higher death total, and some scholars have compared the devastating event to the Holocaust.
