

In Preparation . . . A look at what is to Come

In today's Gospel, last Sunday's Gospel and the Theophany Gospel, we hear about Jesus' baptism from Mark and Matthew. The baptism of Christ is the beginning of His ministry to prepare us for His Kingdom. Christ came to be one of us so that we can one day be as close to being like Him as we can. This is called Theosis. If Christ did not come and dwell among us, we would never be able to achieve Theosis. When the Word of God took on flesh, He was able to experience many of the things we struggle with daily. In today's Gospel, we hear how Jesus after being baptized went into the wilderness. As humans, we are given little temptations and distractions in our daily lives. We have each other and the Church to help us deal with these visits from the devil. In scripture, we know that when Jesus went into the wilderness for forty days of prayer and fasting, He was tempted by the devil himself. He was offered the same things that we are tempted with: physical needs and power. Jesus rebuked Satan and sent him away. The angels came and ministered to Jesus. The Church tells us that we have angels given to us to minister to us as well. In times of struggle, remember we are never alone. Christ has given us the Church in this world and He has given us gifts from the other world. Let us pray that each of us will reach Theosis and be with God for eternity.
