Motherhood: Children Are a Gift From God (part 1 of 3)

Pope Francis was quoted in a sermon in 2014, "Children cry, they are noisy, they don't stop moving. But it really irritates me when I see a child crying in church and someone says they must go out. God's voice is in a child's tears: they must never be kicked out of church."

As Mother's Day fast approaches, we look at the efforts of mothers in bringing their children up in the Lord. Mothers are the ones who children go to when they are in need. In church, it is the same. Mothers meet the needs of their children whether it is teaching them the faith, helping them to focus on the Liturgy, and most likely trying to keep their child from not making too much noise.

Our parish is known far and wide as a kid friendly parish. The Vicar General, Fr. Mike, made a comment: "a parish without the sound of children is one that will not be here in the near future." Children are the present and future of the parish. He continued: "Your parish is small but alive. It is truly blessed."

When we anoint infants with Chrism at their Baptism, we anoint their eyes, ears, nostrils, mouth, chest, hands, and feet saying "The seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit." These are the senses that the Holy Spirit empowers so that we learn about the world we live in and the One who made it. That learning process doesn't begin at the "age of reason." It begins at birth and it is an ongoing process. Young children take in what is around them. As we accommodate to them, they learn to adapt to the world they live in.

We are reminded of the Pharisee and Publican and how the Pharisee was a great temple person who did all the right things but for the wrong reasons. He was prideful, arrogant, and had no love for his brother. Being in the temple on a regular basis did him no good. If we are going to help young children to get in touch with that God-given desire to give glory to God, we adults need to be coming to Church with that same desire. Worship is the time to "lay aside all cares of life, that we may receive the King of All escorted invisibly by ranks of angels."

When we hear the "holy noise" of children in Church it should make us very happy because it tells us the parish has a future. We should be worried when we no longer hear that noise!

Neither should we expect young children to sit there quietly and act like adults; because they aren't adults. For a child, waiting for one minute is like ten minutes.

Now we have a good group of very little children who come to Liturgy. But, of course, they come as very little children. They're sometimes nervous, squirmy, noisy, and fussy. They fall down and hurt themselves and cry. To a large extent, we have to accept them as they are.

We are thankful to the moms as they endure the struggle of bringing their children to church. May our Lady, the Mother of our Lord be with all mothers and their children.


