

Pentecost - Pentecost is the completion of the mission of Christ. Pentecost is the most overlooked Holy Day in the world. The world puts most of the importance on the birth of Christ. It was celebrated for 12 days from December 24th to January 6th. Now many celebrate from Thanksgiving to New Year's Day. Pascha is celebrated by most from Holy Thursday to Easter Sunday, Christ's suffering, death and resurrection. There is more to the story, but our world ends it there. The world never mentions Pentecost. Pentecost is the completion of Christ's mission with the revelation of the Trinity. On this day, we are given the Holy Spirit, without which, Christ's mission would never be fulfilled. Throughout the Bible, we are given glimpses of the Trinity; from the beginning of Genesis to Abraham's visitors to the baptism of Christ and His transfiguration on Mt. Tabor. It must be noted that the feast of Pentecost is not simply the celebration of an event which took place centuries ago. It is the celebration of what must happen and does happen to us in the Church today. We all have died and risen with the Messiah-King, and we all have received his Most Holy Spirit. We are the "temples of the Holy Spirit." God's Spirit dwells in us. We, by our own membership in the Church, have received "the seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit" in the sacrament of chrismation. Pentecost has happened to us. We have received the Holy Spirit.

The Divine Liturgy of Pentecost recalls our baptism into Christ. The kontakion sings of the reversal of Babel as God unites the nations into the unity of his Spirit. When the Most High came down and confused the tongues, He parted the nations. When He divided the tongues of fire, He called all to unity; thus with one voice we glorify the all Holy Spirit.

The troparion proclaims the gathering of the whole universe into God's net through the work of the inspired apostles. The hymns "O Heavenly King" and "We have seen the True Light" are sung for the first time since Easter, calling the Holy Spirit to "come and abide in us," and proclaiming that "we have received the heavenly Spirit." The church building is decorated with green leaves of the summer to show that God's divine Breath comes to renew all creation as the "life-creating Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, King of the Heaven be thou life of my very soul; fill up my being instill within me a heart made pure renewed and made whole.

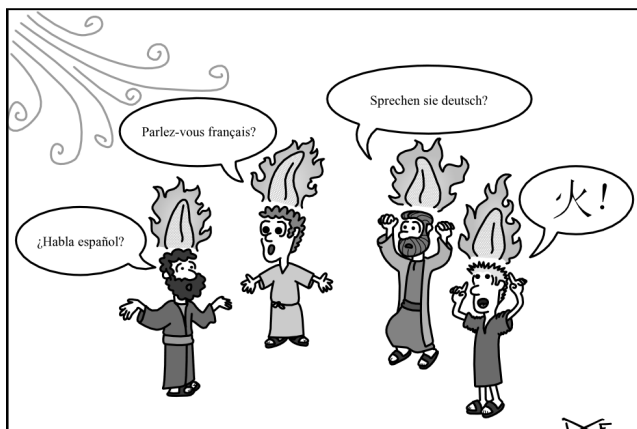
