There are four chains, this represents the Gospel writers – Matthew, Mark, Luke and John

The stationary ring at the top represents that God is the head of the Church


The moveable ring at the top represents Christ coming down from Heaven to save mankind

Second Meaning of the Bells
There are 3 on each chain to represent the Father, Son and Holy Spirit

The bells have two meanings:
The first Meaning of the Bells
The 12 total bells symbolize the 12 Apostles

 There are small handheld censers you can use in your home prayer corner

Pure plant resin such as frankincense or myrrh is burned on a piece of charcoal.



The vessel represents the womb of our Holy Mother the Theotokos

Incense represents our prayers rising to heaven.
“Let my prayer arise in your sight as incense.”
