## Know Your Church . . . Laity Formation

On November 15, we begin the Nativity Fast - known as St. Philip's Fast.

In the world today most people do not fast. Fasting is very important in the life of Christ. Christ Himself fasted and prayed. We are made in His image and likeness. We too need to fast. The world today is in utter turmoil. As followers of Christ, we are to be in the world but not part of the world. Cast off the world and clothe yourself in Christ. Fasting and pray can change the world. Many saints have said this as well as our Lady in many of her apparitions. As of Monday, November 15, there are 40 days until Christmas. Let us fast and pray for 40 day and see how your world will change and as ripples in a pond see how your changes change those around you. What is fasting? Fasting partners with prayer, almsgiving and confession, readying the whole person like an athlete, body, mind, and soul, for an upcoming feast, similar to the way in which Christians would hope to be properly prepared for the Second Coming. To starve yourself, is not fasting. Lessen your food intake, pray more often, help the needy, and examine your soul and make a good confession. We are not monks in a monastery. We need to take small steps and grow in our fasting and prayer. "Christ is not an addition to our life He is our life. Fr. Stephen" Let us take time to change our ways, to draw closer to God, and to prepare ourselves to celebrate God's incarnation.
