The Ukrainian Catholic Church, because of its allegiance to Rome and its Eastern dogma exists as a bridge between the Orthodox East and the Catholic West. Because of this, it was considered a threat to the Soviet government. At the 1946 Synod of Lviv, the Ukrainian Catholic Church was liquidated and incorporated into the Russian Orthodox Church. After the Sobor

in 1946, the Ukrainian Greek Catholic bishops were either executed or imprisoned by Soviet authorities.

Not one of them folded and became Orthodox. Their properties were confiscated and used by the government. After Stalin died, the bishops were released back into their communities but continued to worship underground. Many people noted that it was like they were the first Christians. Many of the underground liturgies were served in people's houses. The people would meet in the woods where they would pray the Stations of the Cross or pray the Rosary. Even though this was a time of persecution and secrecy, there were still men ordained to be priests. One of the homes of a deceased priest became an underground seminary where each man was studying individually so they were unaware of any of the others so that if caught, they had no idea who was studying with them. To learn to sing, they went into the mountains. Patriarch Sviatoslav remembers this period of time from his birth in 1970 until 1988 when Communism fell listening to the divine liturgy on a pirated Vatican Radio signal. Please pray for Ukraine in these troubling times with the Russian military.
