Receiving the Holy Eucharist

Holy Communion - receiving the Eucharist, the true Body and Blood of Jesus under appearances of Bread and Wine, is the most important part of the Liturgy and is the holiest thing we can do here on earth. It is important to receive it in the most reverent way possible. Here are some pointers about the Eucharist.

WHO: any baptized Catholic in the state of grace
 (free from mortal sin, forgiven through confession)

WHEN: during the Communion part of the Liturgy

HOW:

1. Make a small bow before the Sacrament to acknowledge the Real Presence of Christ
2. When approaching the priest holding the chalice, put your hands on your chest, signifying an intimate act of faith
3. Tilt your head back, open your mouth wide, keep your tongue inside, do not lick the spoon or close your mouth on the spoon.
4. The priest will give you Communion while saying a short prayer.
