The Myrrh-bearers

In the beginning of his public life, Jesus often went to Galilee where He performed many miracles. A group of holy women followed Him around, ministering to Him out of their own resources, and even accompanied Him to the foot of the cross, and His entombment; and afterwards, neither losing faith in Him after His death, nor fearing the wrath of the Jewish rulers.

On the morning of the third day after His death, they came to the tomb, bearing ointments they had prepared to anoint His body. It is because of the myrrh-oils, that these Godloving women brought to the tomb of Jesus that they are called the Myrrh-bearers. These women were the first to witness to the Resurrection of Christ, when the angel addressed them: "Fear not you; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he is risen, as he said. Come, and see the place where the Lord was laid." (Matt. 28:5-6). It was at this point the Resurrection was revealed to them, and they were commissioned to go and tell the Apostles. They were, in effect, the apostles to the Apostles.

The Myrrhbearers are traditionally listed as:

Mary Magdalene - the woman whom Jesus cast out 7 demons and follower of Christ

Mary - the mother of Jesus

Mary - the wife of Cleopas, sister-in-law to St. Joseph

Martha of Bethany - Sister of Lazarus

Mary of Bethany - Sister of Lazarus

Joanna - the wife of Chuza the steward of Herod Antipas

Salome - the mother of James and John, the sons of Zebedee, daughter of St. Joseph

Susanna - a wealthy woman who followed Jesus in His ministry.

Joseph of Arimathea - a wealthy member of the Jewish Sanhedrin and a secret follower of Christ Nicodemus - a Pharisee who came to hear the Lord by night
