When one prays the daily Matins, our whole thought of her role in salvation is revealed. Too often, society tries to make less of the role of Mary in the life of Jesus. Some religions avoid talking about her except at Christmas and make her the birthing-parent. That should tell you that she is more than just the birth-parent.

The devil does not want her to be honored. He brought the fall of man through Eve. The salvation of man was brought through Mary. Jesus the Incarnate God was born of the Virgin Mary for our sake.

Think of how special your mom is to you. Why would Jesus' mom be any different. From the Cross He gave her to us.
