Know Your Church . . . Laity Formation

Last week, the priest commemorated all of the living and departed by cutting up the prosphoron and placing the pieces on the diskos. This week, we discuss what happens next. Next, the priest takes the Asterisk (star cover), holds it over the censer and then places it on the diskos, saying: "And the star came and stood over the place where the young child was." He then holds each of the smaller veils over the censer and places them on the discos and the chalice, respectively, saying appropriate prayers for each. Then he takes the larger veil, called the Aër, wraps it around the censer and then covers the chalice and diskos together. Finally, he takes the censer from the deacon and censens the covered Gifts. He then says the concluding Prayer of Offering.

Afterwards, the deacon performs a full censuring of the prothesis, the holy table, the sanctuary, the entire church and the people while he recites the following hymn and Psalm 50 quietly to himself: "In the Tomb with the body, and in Hades with the soul, in Paradise with the thief, and on the Throne with the Father and the Spirit, were you, O Christ, who are everywhere present and fill all things."
