Feast of the Protection of the Holy Mother of God October 1

In 911 AD, the people of the small town of Blachernae near Constantinople were very much afraid because their town was being threatened of invasion from foreign armies. The people gathered in the Blachernae Church to pray an all-night vigil to beg God to protect them from this invasion. The church in which they went to pray contained relics of the clothing once worn by the Blessed Mother, her robe, her veil, and part of her belt. Amongst the people was St. Andrew, the Blessed Fool for Christ, and his disciple, St. Epiphanius.

At about 4 AM, the two men witnessed the dome of the church seeming to disappear and Our Lady surrounded by angels and saints such as St. John the Baptist, St. John the Theologian, and St. Nicholas of Myra descending towards the altar. She knelt in prayer and appeared to beg God to hear the prayers of the people and asked for protection through her intercession. When she finished her prayers, she removed her veil and spread it over the people as a protection. Many in the church witnessed this miracle. When she left, there was a peaceful calm over the gathering, and when morning came, it was evident that the enemy had retreated, and they were indeed safe.

This Holy Day is very important to the people of Ukraine. They have turned to the Mother of God in times of trouble asking for her protection. Throughout Ukrainian Catholic Church there are many, many churches dedicated to the Mother of God. Many are called the Holy Protection or Pokrova in honor of this feast day.
