**Smell**  
 Incense is an ancient symbol of purification and offering; it engages our senses of sight and smell, and the bells of the censor (kadilo) as the deacon incenses the church remind us of the prayer in which we are taking part (as we sing at every celebration of Vespers: "Let my prayer rise like incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice.") . Incense is used to honor the holy table and the Gospel book, and the faithful at prayer are incensed as well, to show that they are dedicated to God. The smoke of incense is said to signify the presence of God, and the smell is said to evoke a sense of God's presence.
