
Catholic Apologetics Peter as the Rock Many Protestants question P

Many Protestants question Peter being made the leader of the Church, or the rock, upon which the church was to be built. Those who have studied the ancient scriptures know that Jesus spoke an ancient language called Farsi, and in this language, the word for rock is Kefa which has no gender, nor does it mean any size of rock, it is just rock. So, when Jesus, who spoke Farsi, says, "And so I say to you, you are Kefa, (Rock) and upon this Kefa (rock) I will build my Church", He is saying that Peter is the successor of control of the church and its teachings, and from Jesus' words, "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Thus, if ALL power is given to Peter, and WHATEVER he binds on earth will be recognized by God in Heaven, then by passing that power to a successor, or instructing the other Apostles to elect replacements, God in Heaven will honor his action until the end of the age. Another argument for Peter's station change in life is his name change. Looking back to Genesis, Abram became Abraham. For his great faith, God renamed him Abraham and made a covenant that he would be the father of a great nation, of many nations. Peter started as Simon, but Jesus changed his name to Peter when He said upon this rock I will build my church. Even in today's society, those entering religious life can be given a new name to show their new life in Christ.
